The **CLIPPERTON DX CLUB** came into existence following a multinational radio expedition to Clipperton Island in March 1978. Clipperton Island is a tiny, uninhabited atoll (a French possession) in the Pacific at  $109^{\circ} 13' W - 10^{\circ} 18' N$  - about 1500 kilometers from the coast of Mexico. In just one week, more than 29000 contacts were made with other amateur stations. The members of this expedition became the founder members of the Clipperton DX Club. Over the years the Club has grown to include over 1300 members from many different countries.

The objective of **CDXC** is to promote and support amateur radio expeditions throughout the world. The purpose of these expeditions is to make radio contact with as many different operators throughout the world as possible from the host nation. The goal can also be to help establish or support amateur radio in the host country by material or technical advice. The **CDXC** has supported many amateur radio expeditions over the years, by means of financial assistance, loan of equipment, or printing of QSL cards.

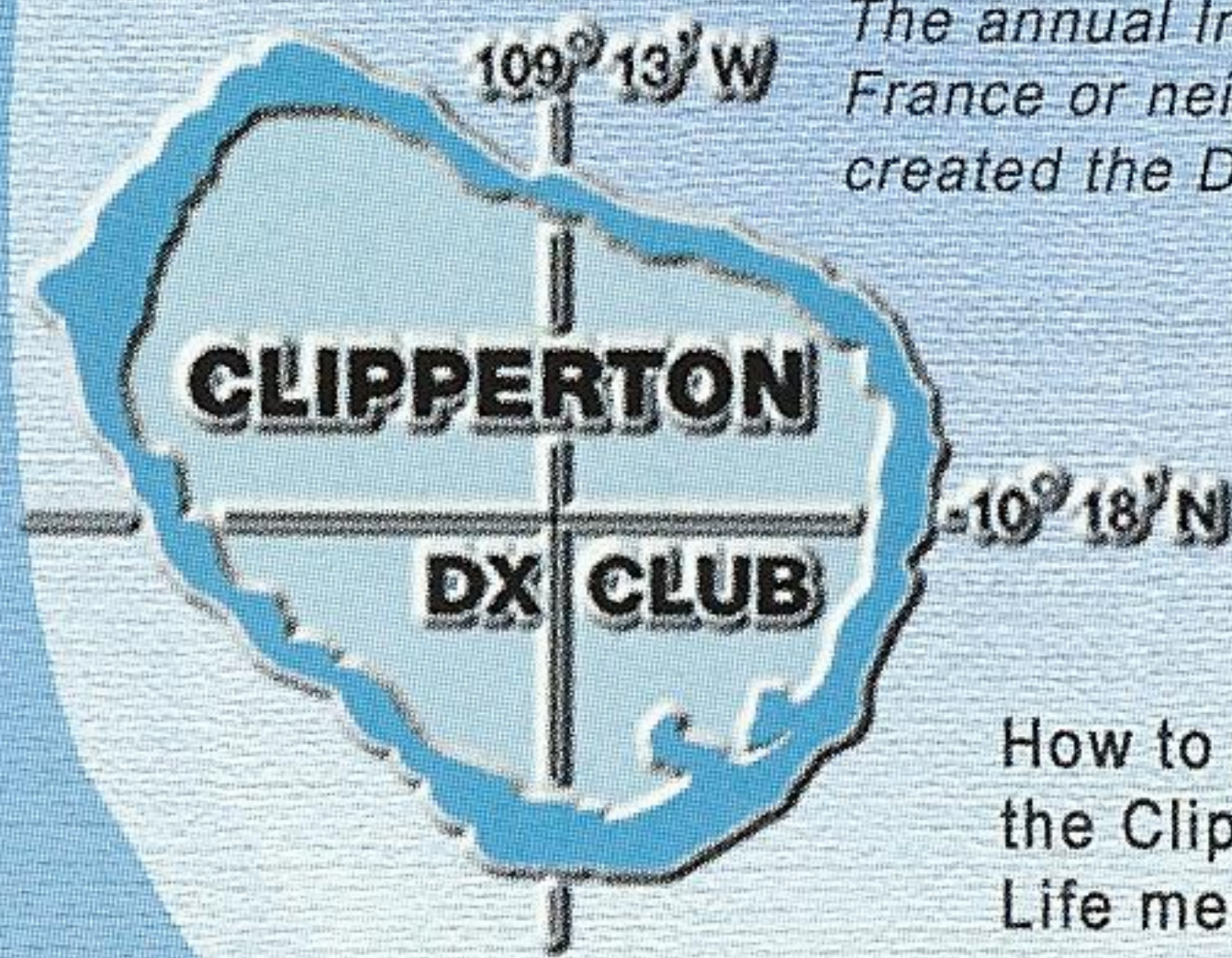
The Club is based in France and is affiliated to REF-UNION, the French national association. The **CDXC** includes the majority of top French DXers, and has members from many other countries. Many CDXC members hold prestigious awards such as the DXCC Honor Roll. CDXC members themselves regularly organise or take part in radio expeditions to many different parts of the world.

The annual International Convention takes place, usually in September, in a different location in France or neighbouring countries, with the participation of many prominent DXers. CDXC has created the DXpedition Award (DXPA) to encourage traffic with radioamateur expeditions.

**CDXC** also serves its members in different ways :

- . Publishes a regular newsletter with information about the Club activities and expeditions
- . Edit the "Gazette du DX" french weekly bulletin by email for DXing infos ([gazette.dx@free.fr](mailto:gazette.dx@free.fr))
- . Maintains a monthly HF column in Radio-Ref, the magazine of REF-Union
- . Members can order QSL cards and other goods from the Club

How to join the Clipperton DX Club ? Anyone interested in DX or DXpedition can join the Clipperton DX Club. There is an annual subscription currently set at 18 € or 22 US\$ - Life membership : 300 € or 370 US\$.
